### The stage 3 cladding deadline is 100 days away - we've created a checklist to help you through it

1. Have you checked with your fire engineer that they will meet the 3 May 2021 deadline?
2. Have you organised for the owner (body corporate) to submit the final fire safety risk assessment to the QBCC?
3. If required, have you asked for an extension? The last day is 5 April 2021.
4. Within 60 days of receipt, the body corporate must give the building fire safety risk assessment to each lot owner and person on the body corporate roll. This requirement applies for 7 years after a copy of the assessment was given to the QBCC. Have you organised delivery or distribution for your lots?
5. Have you rectified, if necessary, any declarations previously made?
